TERM 2 CURRICULUM

LITERACY – This term there will be a continued focus on boosting Literacy attainment through the school. As well as ongoing booster classes and Reading Partnership for some pupils we look forward to celebrating World Book Day when pupils can come to school dressed as a character of their choice.

*If parading with the Comhaltas again this June again as part of the Fermanagh Fleadh, pupils can re-wear their World Book Day costumes.

We encourage you to make extra effort to find time for daily reading with your children at home. We cannot stress the value of this enough in developing fluency and confidence. Please also support your child to learn their weekly spellings and high frequency words to help with overall reading and writing skills.



<u>NUMERACY</u> - Numeracy work and topic maths will continue to be reinforced through practical learning in school. Pupils weekly homework will reflect what is being covered in class as well as activities to develop Mental Maths. As always we encourage you to help your child relate maths to their everyday lives. Examples of this includes: paying attention to times, dates and calculating durations of specific events or involving them in managing a budget and working with money and counting coins to pay for certain items.

<u>ICT</u> - We are really looking forward to further developing our Film Making skills this term and all classes will get the chance to work with digital technology and green screen to produce their own recordings. We will also be looking at aspects of keeping safe online during Internet Safety Week.

PE - Pupils from all classes to wear PE clothes on these days.

Monday's - PE with Eimear from Ulster GAA until mid-term.

Thursdays - PE with Aoife from Core NI until Easter with a focus on Dance and Gymnastics.

Please note that we start the school day with our Daily Walk for all pupils around the school track each morning from 8.30am. A great way to start the day and get our brains and bodies working before lessons.

RSE - Relationships and Sexuality Education

This term we will be focusing on working aspects of the Flourish Programme in to our RSE and PDMU curriculum. These lessons are child friendly and age appropriate and have been developed for Catholic schools to help promote respect, a moral compass and a positive self-image as well as helping children to make informed decisions. We will now look towards painting the back fencing and planting our insect friendly flowers and shrubs to complete this project.

Play 'I Spy' games. Can you find words beginning with...? Can you find a picture of a ...? How many ... can you see?

Make it Fun

Enjoyreadingtogether. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

Create

Use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

Ask Questions

Ask questions about the story as you read it e.g. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Be Seen

Make sure you are seen reading. Keep books magazines at easy reach.

Get Out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

Go Online

Look online & in app stores for appropriate word&spellinggames.

Make Space

Have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

Read everything out loud.
