Dear parents and pupils,

It feels strange preparing a Summer Newsletter when we have had our normal school year cut so short. I want to acknowledge the amazing efforts undertaken by all families to continue with teaching and learning at home during these uncertain and often stressful times. We know that everyone's circumstances are different and you have had to deal with many different things including managing your household, attending work, working from home and caring for vulnerable family members, as well as helping your child(ren) adapt to home learning. I also want to thank our teaching staff who adapted quickly in preparing detailed Home Learning packs and establishing Google Classroom so that we could continue to support and guide our pupils throughout school closure. Also to our non-teaching staff who have worked behind the scenes, helping prepare resources and organising things in school so that we can ensure a safe and secure environment for pupils when they return. Finally, I want to thank our amazing pupils, who have shown such resilience and character. I am sure they have missed their friends and normal school routines but hopefully they have benefitted from unexpected family time and learnt skills in other ways such as baking, crafting, farming and gardening as well as from school books. We have tried to make them feel connected to the school and to each other through activities and challenges on the school website and we hope that they have enjoyed these.

As we look towards September, we await clarification and guidance from Department of Education on the reopening of schools. Although this guidance will not be published until the end of June, it has been indicated that there will be a 'Phased Return to School' with 'Blended Learning' taking place at home and in school, with a certain number of pupils attending on different days so that schools are able to implement social distancing. Once we have received clear directive from the Minister a plan will be drawn up and we will communicate this to you as soon as we can. Our intention is to be as clear and transparent as possible.

We are currently planning for a safe environment for our children, parents and staff. Policies and procedures are being updated and will be available on the school website. To prepare for blended learning, teachers will continue to undertake professional development and training.

We would also like to take on board your views and experiences with home learning over the past 13 weeks. I have published a parental survey on the school website which asks you to reflect on this and consider what might be useful moving forward to September. There is also a 2<sup>nd</sup> survey that focuses on school before closure and links in to our School Development Plan. I would appreciate if you would take the time to complete both as your thoughts and opinions are hugely important. They can be accessed on the 'Parents' section of the school website under 'Surveys'. There is also one for pupils in the Pupil section of the website that you might help them complete. The password to access all of these surveys has been sent by message.

In January we continued with our Sustrans Walk to School programme. We also welcomed our families and grandparents in to school during Catholic Schools Week to celebrate Grandparents Day.



In February our P7's enjoyed some STEM learning as part of our Shared Education programme and we also had brilliant success at the local Credit Union Quiz.



Finally, in March, although we didn't get to share it with the community as we had planned, our pupils showcased their unbelievable gifts and talents at our St. Patrick's Day concert and our girls team were the overall winners in the Fermanagh heat of the Ulster Cumann na mBunscoil blitz.
