<u>SCHOOL NURSE</u> The school nurses will be here on Wed 28th and Thurs 29th April to carry out sight and hearing screening for P1 and P2 pupils who have returned parental consent forms.

ACCELERATED READER - HIT YOUR TARGET! and MATHLETICS - GOING FOR GOLD!

This term we will continue with Accelerated Reader and Mathletics programmes. These are very useful in supporting the Literacy and Numeracy curriculum and we encourage all pupils to make the most of these resources. We will have special prizes and awards for pupils who hit their targets in Accelerated Reader or achieve a Gold Certificate in Mathletics before end of Term.

<u>MUSIC</u> Unfortunately the situation with tin whistle and singing indoors in schools remains under review by the Department. We will continue with other instruments only until guidance changes and post tunes for tin whistle online for the moment. If weather permits, we may hold tin whistle outdoors. We would appreciate payment of £10 per pupil for those participating in music from now until end of term.

<u>SCHOOL COUNCIL</u> Well done to our School Council who contacted Roslea Shamrocks GFC and asked them to help repair the goal posts on our pitch. We are delighted and so grateful that the football club have agreed to replace our old goal posts, provide us with additional portable goals and line out the pitch. Huge thanks from us all to everyone at the club who has made this possible. The School Council also surveyed their classmates to see how they would like to spend Wellbeing money that we had been allocated and the majority of pupils voted for a quiet space outside the school. We are loving our new outdoor classroom that has been bought and assembled and can't wait for the School Council to get decorating it.

<u>ECO COUNCIL</u> The Eco-Council have begun to weed out the school garden beds and we look forward to getting busy with some planting in the summer term ahead.

<u>SUSTRANS-ACTIVE TRAVEL</u> Although we can't gather as normal and walk together, we would like to promote Sustrans Active Travel event which will run from 19th -30th April and encourage you to help your child walk, scoot or cycle to school, or even part of the way. Social distancing should be adhered to at all times.

MAY ASSESSMENTS

In order to allow pupils to settle back in to school we intend to push back scheduled Standardised Assessments in Literacy and Numeracy for pupils in Primary 3-7 until the end of May. We do not want any pressure put on pupils over these tests and are mindful that they will not be fully reflective of pupil performance under normal circumstances. As they have to be marked by an external organisation they will most likely not be back in time to be included in June reports but will be available to parents on request at the end of term.

<u>P6 TRANSFER CLUB</u> Uncertainty remains around the arrangements for Transfer 2021 but we will go ahead and begin Literacy and Numeracy Club on a Monday and Tuesday from 2.50-3.50pm next week for any pupils who may wish to sit the Transfer Test in 2021. If we hear that there will be no entrance exams for the Enniskillen schools, there will be no further clubs.
